Dr Nicholas Milton AM

Artistic Director and Chief Conductor, Willoughby Symphony Orchestra



Dr Nicholas Milton AM is the Chief Conductor and Artistic Director of the Willoughby Symphony Orchestra, where his leadership has ushered in a period of exceptional artistic achievement and audience growth. Associated with the ensemble for nearly 40 years, he has played a transformative role in the orchestra's evolution into one of Australia's most respected community orchestras. Renowned for his charismatic stage presence, dynamic interpretations, and musical integrity, Nicholas continues to earn international acclaim as one of Australia's foremost conductors.

The only Australian conductor ever nominated for a GRAMMY® Award, Nicholas also serves as Artistic Director and Chief Conductor of the Göttingen Symphony Orchestra, one of Germany's most respected concert orchestras. As Chief Conductor of the State Opera House in Klagenfurt, Austria, he led a widely praised new production of Wagner's *Ring Cycle* from 2021 through 2025 – an achievement that earned him a 'Best Conductor' nomination in the 2025 Austrian Music Theatre Prize.

Nicholas has conducted at leading opera houses including Deutsche Oper Berlin, Komische Oper

Berlin, Volksoper Vienna and Opera Australia in Sydney, as well as in Leipzig, Linz, and Innsbruck. His symphonic engagements span Europe and Asia, with appearances alongside renowned ensembles such as the London Philharmonic Orchestra, NDR Elbphilharmonie Orchestra, SWR Symphony Orchestra, Konzerthausorchester Berlin, Radiophilharmonie Hannover, Deutsche Radio Philharmonie Saarbrücken, Stuttgart Philharmonic Orchestra, Bruckner Orchestra Linz, Orchestra della Svizzera Italiana, Staatsorchester Wiesbaden, Dortmund Philharmonic Orchestra, and Sinfonia Varsovia in Poland.

Before focusing exclusively on conducting, Nicholas enjoyed a distinguished career as a violinist. At the age of 19, he was appointed the youngest-ever concertmaster of a major Australian orchestra – the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra – while also performing for eight years as violinist with the acclaimed Macquarie Trio. His conducting career has included leadership roles with the Canberra Symphony Orchestra, the Jena Philharmonic and the State Opera House in Saarbrücken, Germany.

Nicholas studied violin with Harry Curby at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music before pursuing further studies at Michigan State University and The Juilliard School. He holds four master's degrees and a doctorate in music from the City University of New York.

In 2016, he was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) for significant service to the arts as a musician. conductor, and artistic director. A prolific recording artist, Nicholas has released over 60 albums, including the GRAMMY®-nominated recording that brought him international recognition. His Brahms symphony cycle with the Göttingen Symphony Orchestra was recently nominated as Record of the Year by the International Classical Music Awards.





A passionate advocate for music as a force for change, **Dr Sarah Penicka-Smith** is the Artistic
Director and Principal Conductor of River City Voices, and the
Associate Conductor of Willoughby Symphony Orchestra.

Sarah made her international debut at The Dallas Opera in 2018 through the Hart Institute for Women Conductors. She has conducted a number of operas with Sydney companies, as well as many Sydney orchestras. She also works extensively with choirs, including previous positions with Macquarie Singers, Sydney Gay & Lesbian Choir, and Sydney Philharmonia Choirs.

Sarah was one of The Cad Factory's inaugural CASE Incubator residents, a program for contemporary artists with a socially engaged practice, later joining projects in the regional communities of Pinnaroo, South Australia, and Narrandera, New South Wales.

Sarah and her wife Melanie Penicka-Smith are the founders of Penicka-Smith Arts & Event Management, running socially-engaged music projects including Pacific Pride Choir, a touring choir visiting regions where LGBTQIA+rights are less accepted, and the Lifehouse Volunteer Orchestra, performing at the Chris O'Brien Lifehouse. They co-created and produced OCDiva, Dr Eve Klein's one-woman opera for mezzo-soprano and OCD advocate Yasmin Arkinstall.

In 2025, Sarah travelled to the USA and Europe after being awarded a Churchill Fellowship to research socially-engaged orchestral models, and directed the 71st Australian Intervarsity Choral Festival, held in Sydney.



The Willoughby Symphony Orchestra (WSO) is a world-class ensemble with deep roots in the community. Established in 1966, the WSO celebrates its 60th anniversary in 2026, and is one of Australia's oldest and most celebrated orchestras, enriching the life of Willoughby with exceptional music-making. A cultural landmark on Sydney's North Shore, the WSO has earned a reputation for supporting the careers of some of Australia's most exciting emerging musicians and composers.

Performing in its home in the acoustically excellent The Concourse Concert Hall in Chatswood, the WSO is renowned for its outstanding annual concert series. The series encompasses beloved orchestral classics, iconic film music, and family-oriented productions that engage and delight audiences of all ages. The WSO's prestigious Young Composer Award was established in 2004. For more than 20 years, it has been a springboard for a generation of composers, whose pieces are played by a full orchestra as part of a WSO subscription concert.

Featuring up to 80 of Sydney's finest musicians on stage, the orchestra delivers a spectacular subscription series encompassing a remarkable spectrum of symphonic repertoire, coupled with Australia's most outstanding

quest artists, as well as popular classics that inspire and uplift the community. The WSO also presents captivating family concerts – fun and inclusive programs designed to introduce young people to the joy of classical music.

The WSO has been led since 2001 by internationally celebrated orchestral icon and local legend, Chief Conductor and Artistic Director, Dr Nicholas Milton AM, Renowned for his charismatic stage presence, powerful interpretations and compelling musical integrity, Nicholas continues to attract international attention as one of the most outstanding Australian conductors working today.

Nicholas is currently Chief Conductor and Artistic Director of the Göttingen Symphony Orchestra in Germany and has also served for the last four years as Chief Conductor of the State Opera House in Klagenfurt, Austria. Despite a vibrant international schedule, the GRAMMY®-nominated conductor remains passionately committed to the Willoughby Symphony Orchestra, an orchestral family with whom he has been associated for nearly 40 joyful years.




