






ABOUT WILLOUGHBY SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

The Willoughby Symphony Orchestra (WSO) is a world-class ensemble with deep roots in the community. Established in 1966, the WSO is one of Australia's oldest and most celebrated orchestras, enriching the Willoughby community with exceptional music-making. A cultural landmark on Sydney's North Shore, the WSO has supported the careers of some of Australia's most exciting emerging musicians and composers.

Performing in its home, The Concourse Concert Hall, the WSO is renowned for its outstanding annual concert series. The program encompasses beloved orchestral classics, iconic film music, and family-oriented productions that engage and delight audiences of all ages. The WSO's prestigious Young Composer Award was established in 2004. It has been a springboard for a generation of composers, whose pieces are played by a full orchestra as part of a WSO subscription concert.

Featuring up to 80 of Sydney's finest musicians on stage, the orchestra delivers a spectacular subscription series encompassing a remarkable spectrum of symphonic repertoire coupled with Australia's most outstanding guest artists, as well as popular classics that uplift and captivate the community. The WSO

also presents a captivating range of children's programs throughout the season - fun and inclusive concerts designed to introduce young people to the joy of classical music. Alongside a special Christmas concert in December, these events bring musical delight to thousands of people each year.

The WSO has been led since 2001 by internationally celebrated orchestral icon and local legend, Chief Conductor and Artistic Director, Dr Nicholas Milton AM. Renowned for his charismatic stage presence, powerful interpretations and compelling musical integrity, Dr Milton continues to attract international attention as one of the most outstanding Australian conductors working today.

Nicholas is currently Chief Conductor and Artistic Director of the Göttingen Symphony Orchestra in Germany and Chief Conductor of the State Opera House in Klagenfurt, Austria, where he is currently conducting a new production of Wagner's Ring Cycle. Despite a vibrant international schedule, the Grammy-nominated conductor remains passionately committed to the Willoughby Symphony Orchestra, an orchestral family with whom he has been associated for some thirty-five joyful years.

CHIEF CONDUCTOR & ARTISTIC DIRECTOR DR NICHOLAS MILTON AM

Dr Nicholas Milton AM is the Chief Conductor and Artistic Director of the Willoughby Symphony Orchestra, and has been the musical force behind an extraordinary period of success in the orchestra's history. With an association approaching 40 years, Milton's direction has seen the orchestra break all box office records and establish itself as the most successful community orchestra in Australia. Renowned for his charismatic stage presence, powerful interpretations and compelling musical integrity, Nicholas continues to attract international attention as one of the most outstanding Australian conductors working today.

Nicholas currently also holds the position of Artistic Director and Chief Conductor of the Göttingen Symphony Orchestra, one of Germany's most outstanding concert orchestras. In 2021 he was additionally appointed Chief Conductor of the State Opera House of Carinthia, where he is conducting a critically acclaimed new production of Wagner's *Ring Cycle*.


The only Australian conductor ever nominated for a GRAMMY® award, Nicholas has conducted leading orchestras across Europe and Asia, including the London Philharmonic Orchestra, Konzerthausorchester Berlin, NDR Sinfonieorchester Hamburg and Radiophilharmonie Hannover, SWR Radio Sinfonieorchester Stuttgart, Deutsche Radio Philharmonie Saarbrücken, Stuttgart Philharmonic, Dortmund Philharmonic, Staatsorchester Wiesbaden, Staatsorchester Darmstadt, Deutsche Staatsphilharmonie Rheinland-Pfalz, Orchester des Nationaltheaters Mannheim, Bruckner Orchester Linz, Orchestra della

Svizzera Italiana, Sinfonia Varsovia, Nagoya Philharmonic, and China National Symphony Orchestra. As an opera conductor, he has conducted extensively at the Deutsche Oper and Komische Oper in Berlin, at the Volksoper in Vienna, and in Dortmund, Leipzig, Linz, Innsbruck and for Opera Australia in Sydney.

Appointed as the youngest-ever concertmaster of a major Australian orchestra at the age of 19, Nicholas enjoyed a distinguished career as a violinist before dedicating himself to conducting. He was Concertmaster of the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra, Violinist of Australia's Macquarie Trio, and has held the posts of Chief Conductor and Artistic Director of the Canberra Symphony Orchestra, General Music Director of the Jena Philharmonic Orchestra, and General Music Director and Chief Conductor of the State Opera House in Saarbrücken, Germany.

Nicholas studied violin with Harry Curby at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, before continuing studies at Michigan State University and The Juilliard School. He holds four master's degrees, and a Doctorate in Music from the City University of New York. In 2016 he was named a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) for Significant Service to the Arts as a Musician, Conductor and Artistic Director. Nicholas has made over 60 recordings, including a celebrated album for which he was nominated for the GRAMMY® Award.

Symphony Orchestra, Ku-ring-gai Philharmonic Orchestra and Sydney Youth Orchestra. She worked with the West Australian Symphony Orchestra, Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra and the Opera Australia Orchestra as part of the Symphony Australia Conductor Development Program.

Sarah works extensively with choirs and has held positions with Macquarie Singers, St Andrew's College, Sydney Gay & Lesbian Choir, Sydney Philharmonia Choirs and Willoughby Symphony Choir.

With her wife Melanie, Sarah founded the Lifehouse Volunteer Orchestra, bringing music to patients and their families at the Chris O'Brien Lifehouse. They also run Pacific Pride Choir, and have toured Germany, Poland, Vietnam and Cambodia.

Sarah was selected for the inaugural CASE Incubator for socially engaged artists in 2022. Recent projects include a structured improvisation inspired by James Turrell's *Amarna* at MONA for Hobart's Festival of Voices, projects with The Cad Factory in Narrandera, NSW, and Pinnaroo, SA, and producing *OCDiva*, a one-woman opera by Eve Klein.

A passionate advocate for music as a force for change, Dr Sarah Penicka-Smith is a Western Sydney-based conductor with a socially-engaged arts practice. She is Artistic Director and Principal Conductor of River City Voices and Associate Conductor of Willoughby Symphony Orchestra.

Sarah made her international debut at The Dallas Opera in 2018 through the Hart Institute for Women Conductors. She has conducted operas with Sydney companies and led Sydney orchestras including Penrith

MUSIC DIRECTOR WILLOUGHBY SYMPHONY CHOIR PETER ELLIS



For 13 years Peter has been Director of Choral Programs at Barker College, Sydney. As well as teaching and developing curriculum music he directs multiple choral and orchestral ensembles and has conducted Barker's choirs in Gallipoli, Istanbul, New York, Washington, Boston, Edinburgh, York, London, Cambridge, Villers-Bretonneux, Paris, Shanghai, Suzhou and Nanjing. He has been music director for several of Barker's musicals, including the 2023 production of *Les Misérables*.

Formerly on the music staff of St. James', King Street and St. Luke's Anglican Church, Mosman, Peter still makes occasional appearances as an organist and continuo harpsichordist in concerts at UNSW and for various institutions including St. Andrew's Cathedral, Eastern Sydney Orchestra and Queensland Baroque. Peter has a solo trombone work published in the examination booklet by the AMEB and has several choral works awaiting publication.

Peter Ellis has been the Music Director of the Willoughby Symphony Choir since 2015, and has conducted the choir with the Willoughby Symphony Orchestra and Ku-ring-gai Philharmonic Orchestra in major choral works as well as multiple Australian and world premieres.

Originally from Halifax, UK, Peter read Music at the University of Birmingham and gained his PGCE from the University of London Institute of Education. He has performed with the CBSO Chorus at the BBC Proms, on Gramophone award-winning recordings and on Channel 4 and Japanese television.
